

Van Cost + Modification + Living Costs




A van that is already outfitted with everything you need will cost a lot more (around \$10k) than a van you modify yourself (around \$2k-\$6k).





If you buy a van that is already outfitted with everything you need, your modification costs would be small, and you might not have to modify your van at all. If you do decide to modify, conversion can cost anywhere from \$2k to \$15k, depending on your needs and what luxuries you want to include.





It is probably a good idea to keep an emergency fund (around \$1k) in case your van breaks down or another unexpected situation arises. Another \$1k-\$2k can cover your groceries, gas, and other daily living expenses.

How to Convert a Van

Walls and Ceilings:

 Use wood if the van has ribs.
 Use cork boards if the van does not have ribs.

A roof vent or fan can

keep your van cool during the warmest months.

Kitchen Placement Options:

- 1. A Side Door Slide-Out Kitchen
- 2. A kitchen behind the front seats
- 3. A kitchen on the side wall
- ,4. Split Kitchen (use both side walls)
- 5. A kitchen on the side door
 - 6. A Trunk Kitchen

Use solar panels or a generator for **electricity**.

Bed Options: 1. Traditional van bed 2. Bed-Table Hybrid 3. Pull-out bed/ couch

Van flooring:

1. Insulate first

2. Lay down plywood

3. Lay down a

a. Vinyl floor (waterproof) or ab. Linoleum floor (environmentally-friendly)(Don't use hardwood)

Insulate:

If you are traveling in hot places, you do not have to insulate. To keep your van cool, you can use sun reflectors instead.
